1. In a bowl, combine Number cups broth, Number chopped Noun Plural, Adjective salt, a tablespoon of Noun paste, and of course Number chickens.

2. Cook the mixture on Adjective heat and mix Adverb. Sprinkle with Verb Past Tense onions and Adjective carrots.

3. When soup comes to a boil, remove from Noun, and season to taste with Noun.

4. Every bowl of chicken soup needs a side of Noun. You can use it to Verb Base Form up the broth, or just eat it plain. If you don't have that, you can use Noun Plural as a substitute, but Charlie does not recommend it.

5. The top secret to Charlie's chicken soup is all in how you eat it. Make sure to eat the soup while it is still Adjective. Use a Adjective soup Noun Plural to make sure you get nice, big bites. Then, it is

very important to slurp your soup with your Part of Body. Even when Mom says, "Charlie, stop slurping!" you have to keep Verb Present ends in ING because it is the only way to eat chicken soup!
