Phoenix, Arizona

The city of Phoenix was built on the ruins of the <u>Cool Name</u> Grande settlement, occupied between 700 and 1400 A.D., until it was destroyed, most likely by <u>natural disaster</u>. In 1867, <u>First Name</u> of <u>City Name</u>, Arizona, introduced irrigation to the area, then known as <u>Last Name Possessive</u> Mill. Another city pioneer, <u>First Name</u> <u>Last Name</u>, suggested the name of Phoenix after the mythical <u>animal</u> that rose from the ashes, just as the new city arose from the grounds of an <u>Adjective</u> one. The name became <u>Adjective</u> in <u>year</u>. Phoenix became the territory capital in 1889, and Arizona became a state in 1912. These days, Phoenix is one of the most <u>Adjective</u> U.S. cities to visit.
