37. Easier said than \_\_\_\_\_ Verb Past Tense

Meaning: Not as \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective as it appears to be.

Example: Listen, losing \_\_\_\_\_ Noun is easier said than done, many people lack \_\_\_\_\_ Noun.

38. Break a \_\_\_\_\_ Body Part

Meaning: Saying good luck to \_\_\_\_\_ person.

Example: Hey \_\_\_\_\_ Person, it's time for you to get on the stage and present your \_\_\_\_\_ Noun, break a  
\_\_\_\_\_ body part.

39. Up a \_\_\_\_\_ body of water without a paddle

Meaning: In an \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective situation.

40. Give it a \_\_\_\_\_ Noun

Meaning: To give something a \_\_\_\_\_ Noun.

Example: I am absolutely terrified of \_\_\_\_\_ Verb Present ends in ING, but I think once in my life, I will give it a

41. \_\_\_\_\_Animal\_\_\_\_\_ out of water

Meaning: To be out of your \_\_\_\_\_concept\_\_\_\_\_ zone.

Example: \_\_\_\_\_Person\_\_\_\_\_ felt like a \_\_\_\_\_animal\_\_\_\_\_ out of water when his girlfriend took him to a Star Wars convention in \_\_\_\_\_location\_\_\_\_\_.

Meaning: Warm and cosy.

45. Step up your \_\_\_\_\_Noun\_\_\_\_\_

Meaning:

To start \_\_\_\_\_ Verb Present ends in ING better

Example: \_\_\_\_\_ Person better step up her \_\_\_\_\_ Noun if she wants to make big in \_\_\_\_\_ sport.

46. To not see the \_\_\_\_\_ Noun for the \_\_\_\_\_ Noun Plural

Meaning: To be so involved in trivial \_\_\_\_\_ Noun Plural that you don't get the important \_\_\_\_\_ Noun Plural.

Example: He always argues on the silliest topics, it's like he can't see \_\_\_\_\_ Noun for the \_\_\_\_\_ Noun Plural.

47. Lose your \_\_\_\_\_ Noun Plural

Meaning: To go insane.
