\_\_\_\_\_ Verb Base Form to its \_\_\_\_\_ Noun and \_\_\_\_\_ Noun-II will go on for six more weeks; if it does not see  
its \_\_\_\_\_ Noun-I, \_\_\_\_\_ Noun will \_\_\_\_\_ Verb Base Form early.
