# The Gettysburg Address

Number score and Number years ago our Noun Plural brought forth, on this continent, a new Noun, conceived in Liberty, and dedicated to the Noun that all men are created equal.

Now we are engaged in a great Adjective war, testing whether that nation, or any nation so conceived and so Adjective, can long endure. We are met on a great battle-field of that war. We have come to Verb Base Form a portion of that field, as a final resting place for those who here gave their lives that that nation might live. It is altogether fitting and Adjective that we should do this.

But, in a larger sense, we can not Verb Base Form, we can not Verb Base Form, we can not hallow, this ground. The Adjective men, living and dead, who struggled here, have Verb Past Tense it, far above our Adjective power to add or detract. The Noun will little note, nor long remember what we say here, but it can never Verb Base Form what they did here. It is for us the living, rather, to be dedicated here to the unfinished work which they who Verb Past Tense here have thus far so nobly Verb Past Tense. It is rather for us to be here dedicated to the great task remaining before us, that from these honored dead we take increased devotion to that cause for which they gave the last full measure of devotion, that we here highly resolve that these dead shall not have died in vain, that this nation, under Proper Noun, shall have a new birth of freedom, and that government of the people, by the people, for the people, shall not Verb Base Form from the Noun.
