# Soccer

Soccer is a team sport played between two teams of \_\_\_\_\_<sup>Number</sup>\_\_\_\_\_ players each. Soccer is played in accordance with a set of rules, known as the Laws of the \_\_\_\_\_<sup>Plural noun</sup>\_\_\_\_\_. The game is played using a single \_\_\_\_\_<sup>Adjective</sup>\_\_\_\_\_ ball and two teams each compete to get the ball into the other team's goal, thereby scoring a goal.

The Laws of the Game do not specify any player positions other than goalkeeper, but a number of player specialisations have evolved.
