# Snow Skiing

Skiing evolved gradually from snowshoeing and originally was a \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective way of getting from one \_\_\_\_\_ Noun to another in the cold winter. Early forms of skiing resembled today's Nordic, or cross-country, style.

The Norwegian \_\_\_\_\_ Name of a person is often called the \_\_\_\_\_ Noun of modern skiing. In the 19th century, he invented \_\_\_\_\_ Plural noun that enabled the skier to do turns while \_\_\_\_\_ Verb ending in ing down hills. This form of skiing was called Slalom and is now referred to as Telemark skiing or \_\_\_\_\_ Verb ending in ing.
