Satellite Radio

A satellite radio is a Adjective radio signal that is broadcast by a communications Noun which covers a much wider geographical range than terrestrial radio signals.

Satellite radio functions any place there is line of Noun between the antenna and the satellite, as long as there are no major obstructions, such as tunnels or Plural noun. SR audiences can follow a single channel regardless of location within a given range.

Satellite radio is currently at the forefront of the evolution of Noun services in some countries, notably the Proper noun States, but is less prominent in countries with relatively high population densities, where it is easier to reach the bulk of the Plural noun with terrestrial broadcasts, such as the United Location. In the UK and some other countries the contemporary evolution of radio services is focused on Digital Audio Broadcasting (DAB) services rather than on Adjective Plural noun.
