JELL-O is either a powder containing powdered gelatin, flavorings and sugar or artificial \_\_\_\_\_Plural noun\_\_\_\_\_\_ that is dissolved in boiling water, then chilled and allowed to set or pre-prepared pudding or gelatin that comes in a small \_\_\_\_\_\_Adjective \_\_\_\_\_\_cup.
