# Playboy

Playboy's original title was to be \_\_\_\_\_Proper noun Party, but an unrelated outdoor magazine contacted Hefner and informed him that they would legally protect their trademark if he were to launch his magazine with that name. Hefner and co-founder and executive vice president \_\_\_\_\_Name of a person met to discuss the problem and to seek a new name. It was Alexx Mills, who had worked for the \_\_\_\_\_Adjective Playboy Automobile Company in Chicago, who suggested the name Playboy.

The first issue, published in December \_\_\_\_\_Year did not carry a date, as Hefner was unsure whether there would be a second issue. It was produced in Hefner's Hyde Park kitchen. The first centerfold was \_\_\_\_\_Name of a person although the picture used had originally been taken for a calendar, rather than for Playboy.

The famous logo, depicting the stylized profile of a rabbit wearing a \_\_\_\_\_Adjective bow tie, was designed by art designer Art Paul for the magazine's second issue and has appeared on many \_\_\_\_\_Adjective \_\_\_\_\_Plural noun since then.

The magazine celebrated its 50th Anniversary with the January 2004 issue. Celebrations were held at Las Vegas, Los Angeles, New York, and Location during the year to commemorate this event.
